Participation

Before you begin your ACTIVE APRIL CHALLENGE – hosted by Maison de Lunel, please read the following:

Health and Safety

ACTIVE APRIL is open to participants of all backgrounds and we do our best to make The Challenge as accessible and inclusive to all as possible. Nevertheless, due to the physically challenging nature of getting active for 30 minutes every day in April, if you have any medical problem or disability which may affect your involvement in ACTIVE APRIL we would recommend that you seek guidance from your medical practitioner before taking part.

ACTIVE APRIL participants must be a minimum of 18 years old on the 1 April 2021 and be in suitable physical condition to undertake the challenge. ACTIVE APRIL participants should be fully aware of the possible risks inherent in getting active every day and take rests where necessary to avoid injury. ACTIVE APRIL participants under the age of 18 are welcome to participate in The Challenge, with the agreement of, and when accompanied by their parent or guardian.

In completing your registration for ACTIVE APRIL, you understand fully that you are taking part in ACTIVE APRIL at entirely your own risk.

The whole philosophy of ACTIVE APRIL is to get active for 30 minutes every day, your way, and the type and level of activity which is carried out every day is your own choice and risk.

Any suggested physical activities given for ACTIVE APRIL must therefore be taken as an indication of what activity may be achieved each day and not as an obligation of registration on our part.

When processing your personal information we may need to share it with third parties as follows:

Third-party organisations that provide applications/functionality, data processing or IT services:

We share personal information with third parties who support us in providing our Services and help provide, run and manage our internal IT systems. Such third parties may include, for example, providers of information technology, cloud-



based software as a service-providers, identity management, website hosting and management, data analysis, data back-up, security and storage services. The servers powering and facilitating that cloud infrastructure are located in secure data centres around the world, and personal information may be stored in any one of them. We also share your personal information with third-party service providers to assist us with insight analytics. These providers are described in our Cookie Policy.

Payment providers and banks:

We share personal information with third parties who assist us with the processing of payments and refunds.

Campaign and event partners:

Where we run campaigns or events in partnership with other organisations, we will share your personal information with such organisations for use in relation to the operation and administration of that event or campaign.

Third-party email marketing and CRM specialists:

We share personal information with specialist suppliers who assist us in managing our marketing database and sending out our email marketing communications.

Event management and ticketing services:

We share personal information third-party suppliers who help manage any events that we host, including to send out invites to those events and to provide online ticket booking services.

Recruitment agencies and related organisations:

We share personal information with external recruiters, third-party providers that undertake background checks on our behalf and other entities within our group of companies.

Auditors, lawyers, accountants and other professional advisers:

We share personal information with professional services firms who advise and assist us in relation to the lawful and effective management of our organisation and in relation to any disputes we may become involved in.

Law enforcement or other government and regulatory agencies and bodies:

We share personal information with law enforcement or other government and regulatory agencies or other third parties as required by, and in accordance with, applicable law or regulation.

Other third parties:

Occasionally, we may receive requests from third parties with authority to obtain disclosure of personal information, such as to check that we are complying with applicable law and regulation, to investigate an alleged crime, or to establish, exercise or defend legal rights. We will only fulfil requests for personal information where we are permitted to do so in accordance with applicable law or regulation.

This list is non-exhaustive and there may be circumstances where we need to share personal information with other third parties in order to operate our Site and provide our Services.

Transfers outside the European Economic Area ("EEA")

Where necessary in order to deliver our Services, we will transfer personal information to countries outside the EEA.



Non-EEA countries do not have the same data protection laws as the United Kingdom and the EEA. However, when transferring your personal information outside the EEA, we will comply with our legal and regulatory obligations in relation to your personal information, including having a lawful basis for transferring personal information and putting appropriate safeguards in place to ensure an adequate level of protection for the personal information.

We will take reasonable steps to ensure the security of your personal information in accordance with applicable data protection laws. For more information **see below**.

When transferring your personal information outside the EEA, we will ensure that at least one of the following safeguards is implemented:

Adequacy decisions: We will only transfer your personal data to countries that have been deemed to provide an adequate level of protection for personal data by the European Commission. How long we keep your personal information

Regarding personal information we have processed in connection with the supply of our Services to, we will retain personal information relevant to that supply of Services for six years from the date of supply and in compliance with our obligations under the EU General Data Protection Regulation (or similar legislation around the world). We may then destroy such files without further notice or liability.

Regarding any other personal information we have processed, we will retain relevant personal information for three years from the date of our last interaction with the relevant individual and in compliance with our obligations under the EU General Data Protection Regulation (or similar legislation around the world). We may then destroy such files without further notice or liability.

If any personal information is only useful for a short period (e.g. for a specific event or marketing campaign or in relation to recruitment), we may delete it at the end of that period.

If you have opted out of receiving marketing communications from us, we will need to retain certain personal information indefinitely so we know not to send you further marketing communications in the future.

Confidentiality and security of your personal information



We are committed to keeping the personal information you provide to us secure and we will take reasonable precautions to protect your personal information from loss, misuse or alteration. For more information **see below**.

We have implemented information security policies, rules and technical measures to protect the personal information that we have under our control from:

- unauthorised access;
- improper use or disclosure;
- unauthorised modification; and
- unlawful destruction or accidental loss.

All our employees and data processors (i.e. those who process your personal information on our behalf, for the purposes listed above) who have access to and are associated with the processing of personal information are obliged to respect the confidentiality of the personal information of all users of our Site and our Services.

Personal information of children
